Article 1 To elect a Moderator to preside at the Annual Town Meeting, the election to be by written ballot at the commencement of the Regular Town Meeting.

Article 2 To elect the following Town Officials by secret ballot:

Overseer of the Poor
One (1) Member to the School Committee
Four (4) Members to the Planning Board
One (1) Harbor Committee Member
Three-year term
Three-year term

Article 2A Shall an Ordinance entitled "Clam Management Ordinance of the Town of Bremen" be enacted and the present Ordinance entitled "Clam Conservation Ordinance of the Town of Bremen" enacted April 1991 and last revised June 20, 2013 be repealed?

Town Meeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Bremen, qualified to participate and vote in Town affairs, to assemble at the Bremen Town Center in said Town

for the Annual Town Meeting on the afternoon of Saturday, the 28th day of March 2015, commencing at 2:00 p.m. to act on the following Warrant Articles:

As required by State and Federal voting laws, only voters registered in the Town of Bremen are authorized to participate and vote in Annual Town Meetings.

Article 8 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12ths of the budgeted amount in each Operating Account of the 2015 annual budget during the period from January 1, 2016 through March 31, 2016.

Explanation: The Town's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that a municipality must raise in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.

The School Committee recommends \$95,162 for additional local funds and gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$88,549:

Statutorily required amounts for secondary tuition, as well as special education, facilities maintenance, and transportation costs, exceed the State's EPS funding model.

Explanation: The additional local funds are those locally raised funds over and above the Town's local contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and local amounts raised for the annual payment on non-State funded debt service that will help achieve the Town Budget for educational programs.
