

**TOWN OF BREMEN  
SELECTMEN'S MEETING MINUTES  
OCTOBER 1, 2020**

The meeting was called to order at 4:10 p.m.

The meeting began with a hearing on the General Assistance Guidelines and Appendices A through H for the period October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. There were no public comments, and the Guidelines and Appendices were approved by the Selectmen.

The regular Selectmen's Meeting was called to order at 4:12 p.m.

Walter Voskian, Bremen Planning Board, advised that there will be a Planning Board Meeting on October 13. They have an application for an expansion of a lakeside cottage; an informal consultation regarding expansion of a house in the Hockomock Channel. They will also review changes to the Planning Board Bylaws.

The Selectmen appointed two additional Planning Board members.

***On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to appoint Walter Radloff to a three-year term on the Bremen Planning Board.***

***On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to appoint Brian Withers to a two-year term on the Bremen Planning Board.***

The Selectmen were presented with a list of Town Appointments for the 2020/2021 fiscal year (Attachment A).

***On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to make the yearly appointments as noted on Attachment A.***

The Selectmen were presented with a Supplemental Tax Warrant for removal of land in tree growth in the amount of \$467.80.

***On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to approve the Supplemental Tax Warrant in the amount of \$467.80.***

The parking at Town Landing was discussed. After several complaints, the Selectmen agreed to place a sign at Town Landing stating parking for Bremen residents and their guests only.

The Town Center property was discussed. The Town inquired about a cost for surveying both the Town and Library property, which estimate came in at \$4,000. The Town requested the Library pay for half of the survey cost, which they declined.

***On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to approve the Selectmen's Meeting Minutes of 9/03/2020 and 9/24/2020.***


***On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to approve the warrants of 9/11/2020, 9/18/2020, 9/25/2020 and 10/02/2020.***

Ann Nesslage, Bremen Conservation Commission, advised that Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust is interested in maintaining the Hilton-O'Connor Trail via a handshake agreement. The Selectmen would like additional time to discuss this. Coastal Rivers is not interested in Hillside Trail.

Dave Allen and Brian Reeves, MaineDOT, were in attendance at the request of the Selectmen. The Selectmen requested a speed study on Route 32. MaineDOT explained that the speed studies are performed using nationwide engineering standards. The studies have found that the biggest factor in safety is consistency in speed. Dave Allen indicated that MaineDOT is willing to work with the Town to do what they can.


***On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to adjourn at 5:50 p.m.***
