

**TOWN OF BREMEN
SELECTMEN'S MEETING MINUTES
VIA ZOOM
JANUARY 7, 2021 at 5:00 p.m.**

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m.

Ann Nesslage, Bremen Conservation Commission (BCC), advised that the group conducted half of their meeting on January 6th. They will proceed with the other half next week. Susie Davis is working on a list of public access areas in Bremen for the Town website.

Walter Voskian, Bremen Planning Board, advised that the Planning Board has a meeting scheduled for January 12th. They have two applications; expansion and conversion of a property on Biscay Pond and a new dwelling and garage on Webber Pond.

Christa Thorpe, Bremen Broadband Committee, advised that the Committee will send out an e-mail update regarding the timeline for broadband installations. Residents who have applied for fiber installation should be patient; Tidewater is working on over 400 addresses.

Chairperson Pieh advised that she has been discussing the liability issues the Broad Cove School Pod has with the Town with insurance agents. She has some information and will contact the parents.

Selectman Nevins advised the Fire Department has been busy in the past month cutting up fallen trees due to storms. He also advised that there have been auto accidents and reminded people to drive slowly in inclement weather. The First Responders have had their first vaccine shot and will have the second shot in three weeks. Both the Fire Department and the First Responders are in need of new members.

Selectman Nevins advised that newly installed road signs cautioning drivers to slow down and yield to pedestrians on Shore Road have been disappearing. He asked that if anyone has any information on the removal of these signs to please call the Town Office or the Selectmen.

Selectman Nevins attended the recent Nobleboro Jefferson Transfer Station meeting. The yearly fee for the Town will increase by 20%.

The Selectmen reviewed the Marine Law Enforcement Contract with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office for 2021.

On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to approve and sign the Marine Law Enforcement Contract with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office for 2021.


On a motion duly made and seconded, it was voted unanimously to approve and sign the Nobleboro Jefferson Transfer Station Contract for 2021.




